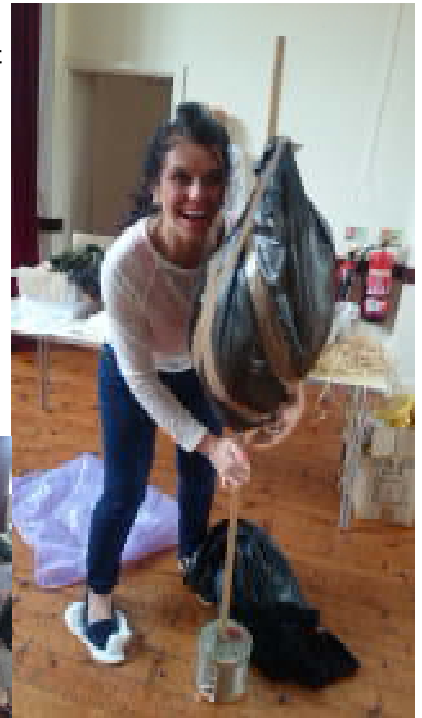
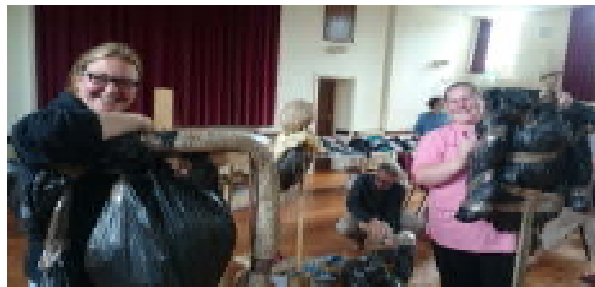
### News

## KS2 News

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In Class 2 this week we have been researching information about the world within the Artic Circle: its fauna, flora and geographical features. The children drew a map of the region and learnt that, unlike Antarctica, the Arctic itself is not a land mass or continent but a frozen sea.

In maths, Year 6 completed their work on reading and drawing conversion tables, finishing with different currencies. They have just started work on finding the mean/average of data sets. Years 3,4 and 5 have continued solving problems converting different measures, specifically length, mass and capacity.

In English we have continued to read our main text 'Shackleton's Journey' and developed the art of writing biographies.

In other news, the children took their bug hotels and set them up in our wooded area, having first explored success strategies on the Internet. We have also practised our rounders' skills, in advance of the competition next week. Well done to Y 5 & 6 who played in the tag rugby festival at Wharfedale Rugby Club on Thursday, coming joint fourth out of 12 teams.



## KS1 News

In literacy this week we have started to look at stories by Julia Donaldson. This week we have focused on 'Room on the broom.' Last Friday we used our woodland area to make magic wands. We had great fun finding the sticks and then decorating them.

Reception children had great fun mixing magic potions in the water tray.

In Maths this week Year Ones have been working on their 2 times table. They were good at counting in twos and answering questions. Year Twos have been working on division. They were challenged with mastery questions and will begin to work on division with remainders.

In our topic work we have been growing cress and looking at the best places to grow the cress. We found out that the cress in the dark place did actually grow, but its small leaves did not turn green.
