GOOD NEWS from Tesco's

What happens next?

The project with the highest number of votes across your region will receive £4,000 (or the amount that was requested up to this value), the second placed project £2,000 (or the amount that was requested up to this value), and the third placed project £1,000. To re-iterate, if you are first in the vote, you will receive the amount that you requested in your application. (£4000).
